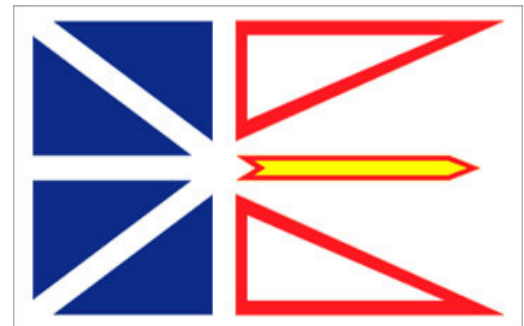
PROGRAM : Meeting on Wednesday January 25, 2006

Labrador is a vast peninsular region of eastern Canada, lying between Hudson Bay on the west and the Atlantic Ocean on the east.

Newfoundland and Labrador, is the easternmost province of [Canada](#). It is also Canada's newest province, having joined the federation in 1949. The province has two sections of unequal size: Newfoundland, which is an island, and the much larger region of Labrador, on the mainland of Canada. Together, these sections have a land area of roughly the size of California.

Labrador is bordered by [Québec](#) province on the south, west, and north; the [Atlantic Ocean](#) on the east; and the [Strait of Belle Isle](#) on the southeast.
